Supporting Michelle Scrogham in Barrow & Furness

Westmorland and Lonsdale CLP has a good record of supporting Labour candidates in neighbouring marginal seats – Morecambe and Lunesdale in 2015, Lancaster and Fleetwood in 2017, and Barrow and Furness in 2019.

For the 2024 General Election, the local party decided to concentrate its campaigning in support of Michelle Scrogham, the Labour Candidate for Barrow and Furness, which was exactly the type of constituency that Labour needed to win at the General Election to form a Government.

Since last Autumn, Westmorland and Lonsdale members have been regularly travelling to Barrow, Ulverston, Millom, Swarthmoor and other parts of the constituency to help Michelle's campaign with leafleting and door knocking.

The result was a Labour win for Michelle with a majority of 5,324 over the Tories, on a 13.8% swing. So, a great result, but not one that should give rise to any complacency since the combined Tory/Reform vote exceeded the Labour vote.

Congratulations to Michelle who joins four other Labour MPs in what is now a Tory-free Cumbria.
